

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INTRODUCTION

To begin with

Correct spelling and the use of a vocabulary appropriate to the situation in which the communication takes place is essential. The use of incorrect spellings and applying inapt technical words will make the reciprocation of expressions ignorant. The selection of improper words may cloud or obscure the meaning the one wishes to convey.

The praxis of employing word processors and presentations are considered as proficient in the use of the applications' spell checkers, thesauri and grammar checkers. Nonetheless, careful proof reading is always preferred which will not flag a correctly - spelled word used incorrectly.

THE DIRECTIVES OF SPELLING

The spelling rules are worth learning ; others are too complicated or have too many exceptions. Having focus on learning rules which addresses the particular spelling problems is always beneficial. The following points will provide on the rules for building new words:

- 1. Words for discussing spelling
- 2. Ten common spelling rules





1. WORDS FOR DISCUSSING SPELLING

- VOWELS—a, e, i, o and u are vowels. CONSONANTS—the other 21 letters of the alphabet.
- PREFIX—element added to the front of a word (e.g. un/in=not, pre=before, anti=against)
- SUFFIX—element added to the end of a word (e.g. -ing, -able, -ed, -ly, ful, -ment, -tion)
- SYLLABLE—a word or section of a word with a single sound (e.g. read, fa_mous, dif_fi_cult)
- STRESS—the emphasis given to a syllable (see underlined syllables: famous, focus, occur, infer



The Sound, /kw/

This sound is ALWAYS spelled with the letters, qu, never anything else.

Using -le

Words ending in -le, such as little, require care. If the vowel sound is short, there must be two consonants between the vowel and the -le. Otherwise, one consonant is enough.

4. Normally you drop a silent e before adding a vowel suffix. However, if the word ends in - ce or -ge and the incoming vowel is an a, o, or u, you cannot cavalierly toss out that silent e. It is not useless: it is keeping its left-hand letter soft, and youra, o, or u will not do that. Thus:

LISTENING: In terms of having an unabridged mastery for a given task in relation with the different languages it is at utmost priority to gain a dominance and confidence in the concerned language so as to express and at the same time to develop the ability in order to convey the thoughts and opinions which should be



sublime and in coordination with the stated context. The 3⁻⁻ tier of the final round of the competition stimulates the sensory perceptions of the participant so as to listen, assume, analyse and guess the spoken or listened words to sum up and to conclude out some magical words which gradually leads them to go ahead in the competition.

SPEAKING: As evidently, language is the most important communicative and proved as an effective and imperative tool since ancient times in order to express our ideas and beliefs. It is the use and the power of language only which enables human kind to acquire a supremacy over all other creatures of the universe. In association with the speaking part of the competition, the entrant is supposed to apply the cognitive and intellectual competences in order to formulate a text while utilising and keeping the correct order of the words. As it is the final of the competition, this level of the contest can be regarded as the most significant part of the whole journey where a panel of experts of all the languages and other dignitaries having mastery in their respective fields play a pivotal role in the selection of the champions of the **Spelling Bee Competition** for the different languages.

In conclusion, it can be highlighted that the 3⁻⁻ round of the competition is the much prominent and promising tier to gain excellence, expertise and proficiency in the field of the languages. The structural and systematic applications with the practical approach make this level more effective and efficient for the participants coming from different regional and religious backgrounds.
